
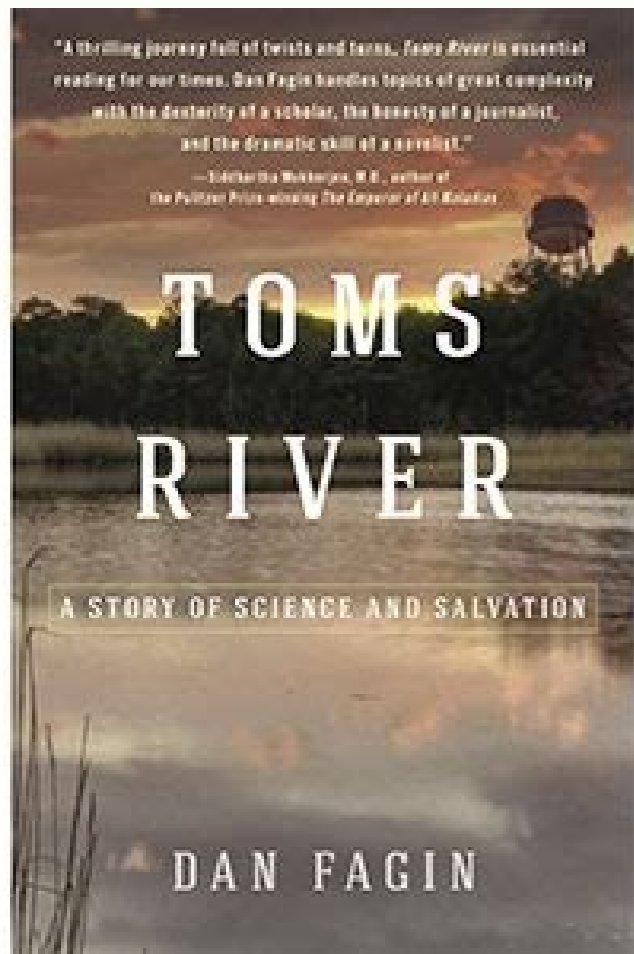
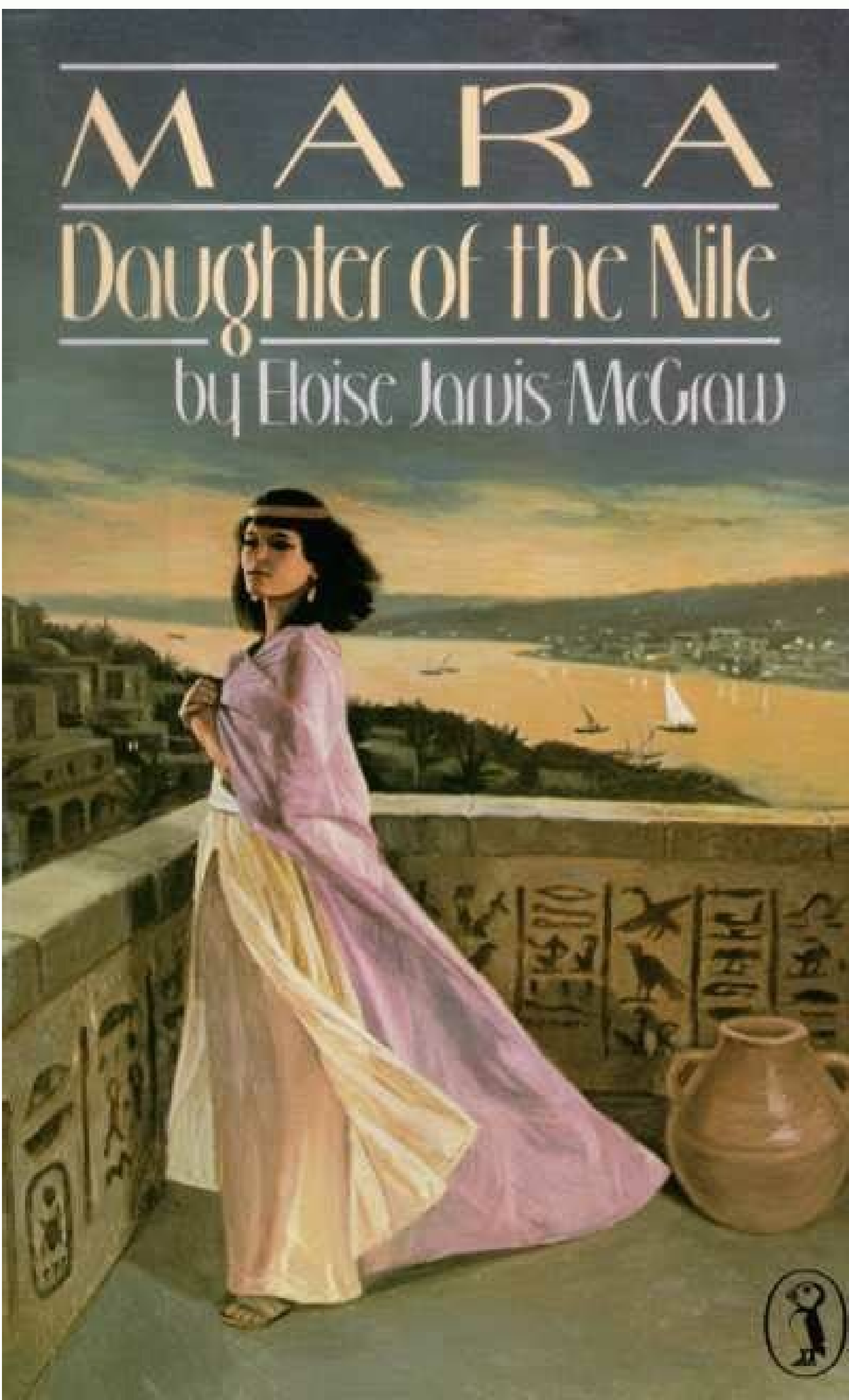

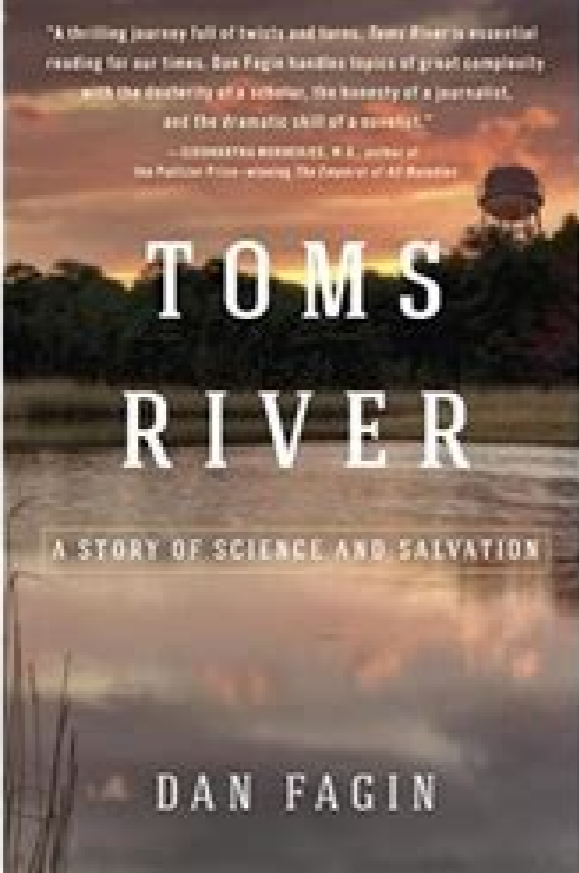

So when Steve Jones’ office phone played one morning in March 1995 and the woman at the end of the line started talking about a possible cluster in Toms River, New Jersey, there was no reason to think that it would be more than another dead end conversation. “The doctors rotate in and out, and I don’t think they actually realized how many patients there were who were from the Toms River area.” Boornazian said. Lisa Boornazian wasn’t a boat. From conversations with the Carters and other families of the Toms River, he had heard some about the chemical plant Ciba-Geigy and its history of pollution. A few weeks after the funeral of Carrie-Anne Carter in the Toms River in February 1995, the two couples were having dinner on Friday evening, and somehow the conversation turned to the funeral and worries of Boornazian on the Toms River. However, when Boornazian and the other nurses looked at the cards of the two-dozens or so patients admitted to the oncology in a typical month, we always seemed to be at least one or two from a city with a population of a year of just eighty thousand people, or from neighboring communities. The following year he found a house in the cancer department at CHOP. Work shifts on the oncology department were arranged so that it made it impossible for nurses to maintain an emotional distance from their assigned patients, since the same three or four nurses took care of a child for months. One in particular stuck in his mind. Their main responsibility was to make sure that state and local environmental health agencies were doing the job that ATSDR soon could not do alone. Their relations with their parents were just as intense. But I loved her,” she recalled. The discussion was not something he planned. The nurses were family. Was the agency considering launching such a study in Toms River? But this was different. They had been around long enough to be a tad cynical about the outsiders, the amateurs who were always demanding investigations without knowing the facts. When Boornazian asked her to check to see if anyone at the EPA was looking into the issue, she agreed. ʼÀ ʼÀ Under the circumstances, Steve Jones felt that he could not say no to the EPA employee who called him, just as Laura Janson felt that she could not say no to her sister-in-law, the oncology nurse. The long shifts, especially the sleepless overnights, created an intimacy among nurse, parent, and child that no one else could share.ÀÀcertainly not the doctors and social workers, who were mere transients by comparison. eÀÀÀThe general sentiment from the doctors was that it was just a coincidence, and that we shouldn’eÀÀÀt worry about it,eÀÀÀ Boornazian recalled. Someone needed to look at it.eÀÀÀ ʼÀ ʼÀ Like Lisa Boornazian and Laura Janson, Jones knew almost nothing about the chemical plant Ciba-Geigy and its history of pollution in Toms River. It was the oldest and most prestigious childreneÀÀÀs hospital in the United States, regularly finishing at the top of national rankings for pediatric care. ʼÀ ʼÀ She and her husband, Adam, came from large families and often got together on weekends with their siblings, many of whom still lived in the Philadelphia area. By 1995, everyone who worked on the oncology ward at Children’eÀÀÀs Hospital knew about Toms River. eÀÀÀPeople said, eÀÀÀOh, don’eÀÀÀt drink the water when you’eÀÀÀre there, and don’eÀÀÀt breathe too deeply,eÀÀÀ eÀÀÀ Boornazian remembered. ʼÀ ʼÀ In their extended family, Laura Janson was an authority figure on environmental matters. Janson would later explain her decision this way: eÀÀÀWhen you work at EPA, people are always saying somethingeÀÀÀs wrong with their water, but She’s your brother-in-law talking, and she’s a nurse in Chop who made the real cancer observations in the kids, they think you’d better follow. Janson checked and learned there were two Superfund sites in the Toms River and neither of them had been the subject of an EPA health study. He was in care for more than a year and Boornazian approached his family. “I remember driving and thinking:” This is the plant that everyone speaks of.” For days later, he could not stop local families he had met in the oncological department. The idea was that the EPA would oversee landfill cleaning, while the ATSDR would recommend EPA on the health risks posed by each waste site. Jones, Boornazian, and Janson worked in tentacle bureaucracies and risk warnings. So he was a little nervous when, while driving to the funeral, he looked at his left at the traffic light on Route 37 and saw the gate of fence and safety of the tentacular factory complex. He worked in the US Environmental Protection Agency’s Philadelphia Regional Office, where he specialized in technical evaluations of hazardous waste sites, although he had never worked on anyone at Toms River. But the ATSDR had very little money to do its job, especially because the number of Superfund sites increased in the late 1980s. When the teenager died on 6 February 1995, Boornazian decided to travel two hours from Philadelphia to attend the funeral in a city he had never visited before: Toms River, New Jersey. You think there’s something going on in the Toms River? ʼÀ eÀ ʼÀ The doctors told her the same thing: No. And when it was time for a funeral, the nurses did what family members do: They showed up and wept. It became a source of dark humor on the ward, with the nurses regularly asking one another: eÀÀÀI wonder when our next patient from Toms River is coming in?eÀÀÀ ʼÀ ʼÀ The doctors ignored the chatter. Many years later, she explained why. So Janson decided to call another federal agency, one that few members of the public had ever heard of. They were especially close to Adam’eÀÀÀs sister, Laura Janson, and her husband, Eric. Only rarely did Jones field calls from the public about supposed cancer clusters; when he did, they usually ended in mutual frustration. How could the doctors be expected to pay attention to something as trivial as a home address? They were far too busy to get to know the families the way the nurses did. eÀÀÀWhat she was expressing to me was very specific,eÀÀÀ Jones remembered. All of the nurses noticed it.eÀÀÀ CHOP drew its young cancer patients from a vast geographic area of more than ten million people, and some families would travel even farther’eÀÀÀfrom as far away as South America and the Middle East, if they could afford it. By 1996, the EPA was spending well over one billion dollars per year (about 20 percent of its budget) on Superfund; the entire ATSDR budget, meanwhile, was just \$60 million. eÀÀÀWe began to notice that we were getting a lot of kids from the Toms River area’eÀÀÀ in 1993 and 1994, Boornazian recalled. Unlike so many callers, Janson was not passing along a vague report in which all of the most common types of adult cancersÀÀÀ lung, breast, skin, and all the resteÀÀÀ were lumped together. eÀÀÀThe younger kids mostly had no idea.eÀÀÀ Those with brain or bone cancers faced long odds.
